Lesson Title: Joseph, the Dreamer Text: Genesis Chapter 37

Lesson Summary: The beginning of Joseph's story is unique in that it is not a clear good guy / bad guy lesson. Joseph's brothers may be clearing in the wrong, and yet, Joseph's actions did not help the situation. Obviously, God was communicating with Joseph and had some great plans for him, but rather than keep these things to himself, he bragged about them to his brothers. (or perhaps naively shared them innocently?) At any rate, whether he was proud and bragging or foolishly blabbing, the fact is his *perceived* arrogance led to his downfall. (quite literally, actually!) This 'fall' is ironically a part of God's plan to get him to Egypt so he can in time save the very brother who attack him! This lesson is a great opportunity both the express the fact that God has a great plan for us all, and that we need to be listening for that call, but at the same time to have humility and patience for God to make things happen in his time. Kids need to challenged both to see themselves positively as God sees them, but also to be humble about the gifts he has given them, seeing that they are given to serve, not to elevate one's self.

	God has a great plan for everyone's life, and he reveals that plan in	
	different ways to different people. We should feel good about who we	
	are and the gifts God has given us, but we also need to stay humble.	
Object Lesson	MAGNIFIER – who are you magnifying?? Show a magnifying	
	glass. What is it for? It is to make things look closer and bigger. When we	

	brag, we are magnifying ourselves. We SHOULD be magnifying God and others, not ourselves. Ask yourself, who are you magnifying? Yourself? God? Or Others?	
Verse	Proverbs 16:18 Pride goes before destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall.2 Corinthians 4:7 For who makes you different from anyone else? What do you have that you did not receive? And if you did receive it, why do you boast as though you did not?	
Assignment	Make a list of the blessing God has given you, and thank Him for them, and ask him to help you to be humble and not proud about them.	

OPTIONAL:

Skit	A Pile of Pride. Each actor walks out bragging about something and trips over a rock and falls, a pile builds up. Finally last one comes out and sees pile and comments, 'Hmmm, must be a pile of pride.'	
Story	50 Bicycles from Grampa. Boy's Grampa tells him that he was cleaning out his garage and found a set of bicycles, there are only 50 he says, but he will give them to his grandson if he can come over and get them. The boy starts bragging to all his friends about how he is going to have 50 bicycles! They ask if he will share, and he says no, they are ALL for him! Then, he gets his friends to do things for him for a bicycle – mow the lawn, take out the garbage, paint the fence, do his other chores, and then finally, Saturday comes and he goes to visit his grampa who gives him a deck of cards. The boy asks, "What about the bicycles?" and Grampa says, "Why, those <i>are</i> bicycles, and I checked and only the jokers are missing. So it is a complete deck. Hope you enjoy them!" The grandson did not realize that playing cards used to be called bicycles because of the picture of a bicycle on the back of them. He has to go face his friends with just a deck of cards.

DREAM FACTS

Muscles are paralyzed during REM sleep, to prevent you from acting out the dream images flitting through your mind.

Lucid Dreaming is being conscious that you are dreaming.

Events like sounds and feelings are incorporated into the dream tale.

1. One third of our lives is spent sleeping.

2. In your lifetime, you would've spent about 6 years of it dreaming. That is more than 2,100 days spent in a different world.

3. Dreams have been here as long as mankind. Back in the Roman Era, striking and significant dreams were submitted to the Senate for analysis and interpretation.

4. Everybody dreams. EVERYBODY! Simply because you do not remember your a dream does not mean that you did not dream.

5. We dream on average of one or two hours every night. And we often even have 4-7 dreams in one night.

6. Blind people do dream. Although their dreams may not consist of vivid images, blind people can clearly recall and describe the sounds they hear or the textures they come in contact with in their dream. Their hearing and tactility are hyper-sensitive.

7. Five minutes after the end of the dream, half the content is forgotten. After ten minutes, 90% is lost.

8. The word dream stems from the Middle English word, dreme which means "joy" and "music".

9. Studies have shown that our brain waves are more active when we are dreaming than when we are awake.

10. Dreamers who are awakened right after REM sleep, are able to recall their dreams more vividly than those who slept through the night until morning.

11. People who are giving up smoking have longer and more intense dreams.

12. Toddlers do not dream about themselves. They do not appear in their own dreams until the age of 3 or 4.

13. If you are snoring, then you cannot be dreaming.

14. Nightmares are common in children, typically beginning at around age 3 and occurring up to age 7-8.

15. In a poll, 67% of Americans have experienced Deja Vu in their dreams, occurring more often in females than males.
